TEAMS FROM UM SCHOOL OF LAW  
PLACE IN REGIONAL COMPETITION

MISSOULA--

Two moot court teams made up of second-year law students at the University of Montana placed second and third, respectively, in the regional competition, held March 21 at Tacoma, Wash., of the National Appellate Advocacy Competition

A UM student, Shelley Hopkins, Missoula, also won the award for best oral argument. Hopkins is the student member of the Montana Board of Regents.

Six teams from law schools at UM; Gonzaga University, Spokane, Wash.; University of Idaho, Moscow; and the University of Puget Sound, the host school, took part.

Members of the UM team that placed second are Joan Newman and Jim Handley, both of Missoula. The five Washington state judges on the panel for the final round split three to two in giving Gonzaga the decision over UM.

The UM team that came in third is comprised of Kimberly Kradolfer, Bozeman, and Hopkins.

J. Martin Burke, assistant professor, UM School of Law, is the UM teams' faculty adviser.
