Poet Cynthia Macdonald, co-director of the creative writing program at the University of Houston, Tex., will give workshops, a lecture and a reading during a week's residency at the University of Montana Monday through Friday, April 6-10.

Macdonald has published three volumes of poetry: "Transplants," "Amputations" and "(W)holes." A fourth book, "Traveling up the Nile," will be released in 1982 by Knopf. She also writes librettos and songs and has been a concert and opera singer in the United States, Europe and Japan.

Her visit is the third of four writers' residencies funded this year at UM by a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts.

Except for the graduate poetry workshop Monday, all sessions are open to the public without charge. Events scheduled are:
