UM SLATES NATIONAL RED CROSS AQUATIC FIRST AID AND SMALL CRAFT SCHOOL

MISSOULA--

A National Aquatic, First Aid and Small Craft School scheduled at the University of Montana June 12 through 20 will offer training and certification for Red Cross water safety, first aid and small craft instructors.

All candidates must submit completed application forms and a \$35 non-refundable deposit to the UM by May 15; and candidates for instructor-trainer courses must also complete certain preliminary requirements before April 15.

The school is sponsored by the American Red Cross; the UM Department of Health and Physical Education; and the UM Center for Continuing Education and Summer Programs.

Those who successfully complete the program for instructors will join 3,000 other Red Cross instructors in Montana and 12 million nationwide. They will learn life-saving techniques applicable in emergencies and will be qualified for such jobs as lifeguard, first-aid teacher and swimming instructor.

The cost of the school is \$170 per person, which includes room, board, books and supplies. Commuters may apply for a partial fee waiver.
