UM GRADUATE STUDENT'S WORK CHOSEN FOR TRAVELING REGIONAL EXHIBITION

MISSOULA--

Robert S. Wick, Great Falls, a graduate student in art at the University of Montana, is one of 25 artists whose work will be included in the Northern Rockies Clay 1981 exhibition.

The Hockaday Center for the Arts, Kalispell, organized the exhibition. The center's juror, Tom Coleman, selected 25 exhibitors after considering 888 slides from 143 artists. The chosen include such nationally known Montana artists as Rudy Autio, Ken D. Little and David Shaner.
