UM PROFESSOR AND STUDENTS HONORED BY MHEA

MISSOULA--

A former chairwoman of the University of Montana home economics department and two UM students were honored at the annual meeting of the Montana Home Economics Association, held April 9 through 11 in Miles City.

Professor Emeritus Emma Briscoe, a past president of MHEA, received a merit award for her contribution to the association. She authored the history of MHEA, published in 1976.

Susan Gust, Big Timber, a junior home economics major, was given a merit award for her "butstanding contribution as the first MHEA legislative intern." She served at the Montana Legislature winter quarter and gave a legislative update at the meeting.

Margaret Wyckoff, Superior, a senior in home economics, was awarded a \$50 U. S. savings bond for "Outstanding Undergraduate Research." She presented her research paper at the meeting.

Sara Steensland, chairwoman of the UM home economics department and the MHEA Foundation, presided at a panel discussion of "Economics of Food." Other faculty attending were Marlene Bachmann, who chaired the Program Thrust Committee, and Vanetta Lewis, adviser to the state student section of MHEA.
