WORLD WAR I CLASSICS SUBJECT OF  
UM WEEKEND COURSE IN GREAT FALLS

MISSOULA--

A course titled "Autobiographies in History: The Lost Generation" will be offered in Great Falls two weekends in May by Dr. Robert Lindsay, professor of history at the University of Montana. Pre-registration by May 1 is required.

The course will analyse the political and social forces that produced two World War I classics: "Goodbye to All That" by Robert Graves and "Testament of Youth" by Vera Brittain.

The class will meet at Great Falls High School Fridays May 1 and 8 from 6 to 9 p.m. and Saturdays May 2 and 9 from 9 a.m. to noon and from 1 to 5 p.m.

The course may be taken for two undergraduate or graduate credits in history. The fee is \$60.
