WORKS BY UM COMPOSITION STUDENTS
WILL PREMIER IN CAMPUS RECITALS

MISSOULA--

Compositions by students of Dr. Donald O. Johnston, professor of music at the University of Montana, will receive their first public performance at free concerts in the UM Music Recital Hall Monday and Tuesday, May 4 and 5, at 8 p.m. The Monday program will consist primarily of vocal and choral works, and the Tuesday program will feature instrumental pieces.

The compositions will be performed by the UM Choir, conducted by Donald Carey; the UM Band, conducted by Thomas Cook; and student soloists and chamber music groups.

In addition, "Leaves," a new work for piano by Patrick Williams of the voice faculty, will be played by Phillip Clarke of the piano faculty. The other faculty work to be premiered is Johnston's "Ricercar," which will be performed by the UM Wind Ensemble.
