This course is concerned with armed conflict as a social phenomenon. It does not involve analysis of battles, campaigns or military history. Instead several aspects of war as human endeavor are considered. For our purposes armed conflict may be defined as the organized, systematic and persistent use of force for defined objectives. The course generally follows a chronological pattern in accordance with the chapter sequence of the textbook. The focus is upon the relationship between armed conflict and the many different roles it plays in society. This relationship will be examined in terms of several variables: sociological, psychological, technological, political, and economic.
