UM DEAN AMONG EDUCATORS CHOSEN
FOR SUMMER PROGRAM AT HARVARD

MISSOULA--

Richard A. Solberg, dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Montana, is one of 90 senior-level college and university administrators in the United States chosen to take part in a five-week program conducted by the Harvard University Institute for Educational Management.

The institute's Management Development Program will be in session on the Harvard campus, Cambridge, Mass., June 21 through July 24.

Solberg's participation in the program will be supported by the UM and a grant from the Shell Foundation.

The annual summer program is the keystone activity of the institute, which was founded in 1970. The program consists of intensive case studies, seminars and workshops on critical issues faced by higher education. The faculty is drawn primarily from the Harvard Graduate Schools of Business Administration and Education.

Last year Solberg was elected to a three-year term on the board of directors of the National Council of Colleges of Arts and Sciences. The council is comprised of deans of colleges from universities and colleges throughout the country.

More recently he accepted appointment to the Commission on Arts and Sciences of the National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges. The association is the primary governing body for most of the nation's public institutions of higher education. The commission is an appointed body of individuals selected from the association's member institutions to advise and direct the association's activities on issues of national importance concerning the arts and sciences.
