SWEDISH PROFESSOR TO SPEAK AT UM ON FOREST FIRES, NOV. 16

A Swedish professor will lecture at a University of Montana botany seminar on forest fires at 4 p.m. Monday, Nov. 16, in UM Botany Building Room 307.

Dr. Olle Zachrisson, a professor at the Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences, Umea, Sweden, will deliver a lecture titled "The Influence of Fires on Swedish Boreal Forests," concerning the effects of fire on forests and wildlife. The lecture is free to the public.

Zachrisson, known internationally for his research and publications on forest fires, will be in Missoula primarily to visit the U.S. Forest Service Northern Forest Fire Laboratory.

A public reception to meet the scientist will be held from 3:30 to 4 p.m., Nov. 16 in Botany 202.

The lecture will be one in a series of botany graduate seminar guest lectures offered each Monday at 4 p.m. during fall quarter at UM. The public is invited to attend. For more information, interested persons may call the UM botany department at 243-5222.
