UNIVERSITY STUDENTS PREPARE FOR SPRING STUDY IN SPAIN

MISSOULA--

Speaking Spanish with Spanish families, touring cities in Spain and Portugal and studying at a university in Salamanca, Spain, will be part of a 10-week study abroad program for University of Montana students spring quarter.

The program, in its 10th year, is sponsored by the UM Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures Spanish section and is open to anyone who has had the equivalent of four or five quarters of the Spanish language and can afford the approximate \$2,000 in program costs.

Students can earn up to 16 UM credits through a four-week intensive language course, suited for their levels of competency and taught by native Spanish professors, at the Colegio de Espana in Salamanca, located 150 miles northwest of Madrid. Credits also will be earned through travel and study with Dr. Stanley L. Rose, associate professor of foreign language in Spanish at UM, who will lead the tour.

Students will have an opportunity to stay with host Spanish families in Salamanca, directly learning about Spanish culture.

Travel will include a week in the Madrid area, touring museums, palaces and other historical sites, several weeks through southern Spain in cities like Granada, Seville and Cordoba, which represent the Moorish influence on the country, and some time in Lisbon, Portugal.

Program costs will include tuitions, air fares, excursion fees and most board and room. The tour will leave in late March and students may return in

early June or stay longer to travel more.

Rose said that interested persons must take an orientation course at UM during the 1982 winter quarter to learn more about Spanish as spoken in Spain, become apprised of recent Spanish political and economic history and prepare for travel. He added that he will accept persons into the courses through the beginning of winter quarter.
