- February 17 "David Hume on 'Reason is and ought to be the Slave of the Passions'"
- February 24 "Karl Marx on Ideal Communism after the 'Withering Away of the State'"
- March 3 "Jean-Paul Sartre, Atheist Existentialist"
- March 10 An imaginary dialogue among the philosophers of the earlier lectures
