EVENING COURSE IN FLOOR LOOM WEAVING PRESENTED AT UM

A beginning and intermediate floor loom weaving course will be presented on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 7 to 10 p.m. starting April 6. The six-week course will cost \$60 and will be taught by Adele Furby in the Women's Center Weaving Room on the University of Montana campus.

The course takes advantage of the 13 looms in the Women's Center and is designed for students who have had little or no experience with loom weaving. However, intermediate weavers will receive more advanced instruction. The focus of the course is on construction from a structural point of view, unique esthetic qualities of fibers and elements of design and color and how they are integrated with the weave structure.

Participants may receive two undergraduate credits in Art or Home Economics 395. Registration will be completed at the first class.
