### MISSOULA TEACHER RECEIVES HARRIS SCHOLARSHIP

MISSOULA--

Terry Lynn Wiedmer, a fourth-grade teacher at Hawthorne School, Missoula, has been selected by a faculty committee in the University of Montana School of Education to receive the George and Laurine Harris Scholarship for 1982-83, according to John Hunt, acting dean of the school.

The \$1,000 scholarship is awarded annually to a UM graduate student in education on the basis of academic performance, motivation, character, ability and potential.

The scholarship was established in the UM Foundation by the George and Laurine Harris Charitable Trust, set up under the will of Laurine Harris, who was a school counselor and history teacher in Great Falls. Her husband, George G. Harris, was a founding member of the Great Falls law firm of Church, Harris, Johnson & Williams.

After graduation from Sentinel High School, Missoula, Wiedmer enrolled at UM, earning a bachelor's degree with high honors in elementary education in 1972 and a master of education degree in 1975. She is now working toward a doctorate. She maintained a grade-point average of 3.9 of a possible 4.0 (A) in her graduate work.
