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UM SUMMER SESSION OFFERS COMPUTER TRAINING FOR TEACHERS, CHILDREN

MISSOULA--

A series of computer workshops for teachers is scheduled at the University of Montana during summer session. The series consists of six independent, one-week minicourses that focus on the theory and techniques of using microcomputers in the classroom.

Each one-week course may be taken for one credit in mathematics or computer science. No computer experience is required.

The courses are Teaching Computer Literacy, June 14-18; Computers and Teaching: Teaching BASIC, June 21-25; Pilot for Teachers, June 21-25; PASCAL for Teachers, June 21-25; Teaching Advanced BASIC, June 28-July 2; and LOGO for Teachers, June 28-July 2.

Enrollment in the courses is limited so reservations should be made early. Information about registration fees and board and room is contained in the summer catalog, which may be obtained from the Center for Continuing Education and Summer Programs, 125 Main Hall.

Two computer day camps for children of summer session students, faculty, staff and townspeople are also scheduled. They will be in session from 9 a.m. to noon June 14-25 and June 28-July 10. They will cover LOGO, BASIC and Advanced. Students who will enter the fifth through 12th grades in the fall are eligible to apply.

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
