The nationally known actors will be in Missoula for the Hospice Celebrity Ball, scheduled Friday at 8 p.m. at the Village Red Lion Motor Inn. Their activities at UM are made possible by Hospice of Missoula.

Taylor currently stars as Conrad Peckler, the bureaucratic hospital administrator in the television series "House Calls." He has appeared in segments of "MASH" and "Family."

Murphy's movie credits include "To Kill a Mocking Bird," "Walking Tall," and "40 Carats." She received an Emmy award for best supporting actress in the film "Eleanor and Franklin." She played Lady Macbeth at the Stratford, Conn., Shakespeare Festival.
