UM STUDENT'S PAPER JUDGED BEST IN REGION

MISSOULA--

A paper by University of Montana religious studies major from Great Falls was judged best in the Pacific Northwest in the undergraduate competition at the joint regional meeting of the American Academy of Religion and the Society of Biblical Literature at Marylhurst, Ore., April 22-24.

Richard Moraskie received a cash award for his presentation titled "The Parable of the Talents as Metaphor." The UM junior is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Moraskie of Great Falls.

Only papers by undergraduates were eligible for awards, but Paula M. McNutt, a UM graduate student in interdisciplinary studies, also presented a paper. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. DeWitt D. McNutt Jr., Coeur d'Alene, Idaho.

Others from UM on the program were Dr. James W. Flanagan, religious studies department chairman, and Dr. William C. Shepherd, professor of religious studies.
