UM SEMINARS TO FOCUS ON EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION

MISSOULA--

The University of Montana School of Education will conduct two seminars during July for teachers and school administrators.

The various political aspects of school administration will be the subject of a seminar titled "Politics of Administration," July 1 and 2, to be conducted by Lawrence Iannaccone, professor of school administration at the University of California at Santa Barbara. Iannaccone was recently honored by the American Association for School Administrators as the Outstanding Professor of School Administration in 1981.

"Imagination in Curriculum" is the title of a seminar on innovative approaches to school curriculum, to be held July 15 and 16. Eliot Eisner, professor of education at Stanford, will conduct the seminar.
