- Explain the meanings of operations and the connections between those operations, concepts, and procedures in doing computations (using both standard and nonstandard algorithms),
- interpret story problems, and write story problems;
- Evaluate the efficiency of and use various representations of numbers and operations, as well as their applications to problem solving;
- Employ various modeling strategies to solve problems in real world contexts;
- Recognize some common misconceptions and be able to understand the faulty reasoning behind those misconceptions;
- Explain their reasoning, both verbally and in writing, while solving problems.

Mid-terms and Final

One mid-term exam will be given in March. The final will be cumulative in the traditional sense. It will be longer than the mid-term exam and will feature some questions relating directly to material taught earlier in the course.
