TROUBLED FAMILY WORKSHOPS

MISSOULA--

Dr. Philip Bornstein, professor of clinical psychology at the University of Montana, is offering three, two-day workshops titled, "Treating Troubled Families," to family therapy professionals.

Advance registration is required and participants will be selected on a first-come, first-serve basis. The registration fee is \$135. In addition, one graduate credit in psychology can be earned by attending the workshop.

The workshop is designed to help professionals such as psychologists, social workers, family counselors and clergy to analyze and counsel troubled families and couples.

Topics include how to deal with problems encountered by inexperienced family counselors, how to intervene in a relationship to resolve problems, and the latest research and findings in marital and family counseling.

Bornstein will conduct the workshops in Great Falls on Sept. 21 and 22; in Butte on Oct. 13 and 14; and in Missoula on Nov. 3 and 4. The sessions will last from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. with a break for lunch each day.
