Fulbright Scholarships for the 1983-84 academic year are available at Dr. Robert Acker's office in Social Science 207 at the UM until Oct. 18.

The Fulbright Scholarship program offers students opportunities to study in foreign countries.

The program was established in 1961 and is designed to increase mutual understanding between people of the United States and foreign countries through the exchange of people, knowledge and skills.

About 524 scholarships to 56 countries are available this year.

Selection is based on academic and/or professional record, the validity and feasibility of the proposed research and the applicant's language preparation, and personal qualifications.

Preference is given to applicants who have not had previous opportunities to study abroad.

Applicants must be citizens of the United States at the time of application and must generally have a bachelor of arts degree or its equivalent by the beginning date of the grant, September 1983.
