UM COURSE FOR TEACHERS
OFFERED AT CONDON

MISSOULA--

"Enriching Your Reading and Science Programs," an education course for teachers of kindergarten through grade 12, will be taught on Friday, Nov. 12, from 6 to 9 p.m. and Saturday, Nov. 13, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Swan Valley School in Condon. The course is offered through the Continuing Education Program at the University of Montana.

Enrollment is limited, and pre-registration by Oct. 29 is required. Cost for the course is \$30 plus \$3 for materials. Participants may earn one graduate credit.

The course is designed to assist K-12 teachers improve their reading and science programs. Topics will include helping children become authors, developing skill enhancement activities, individualizing instruction using innovative materials to facilitate inquiry and modifying science curriculum materials. Instructors are Dr. Louise Bell, assistant professor at UM and Dr. Greg Stephanich from the University of Northern Iowa.
