Philip Bornstein, professor of clinical psychology at the University of Montana, is offering a two-day workshop entitled "Treating Troubled Families" in Missoula, Nov. 3-4 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Bornstein has been affiliated with the University of Montana since 1973. He is the author of the recent book "Loving: A Self-Help Guide to Relationship Satisfaction" and co-editor of the forthcoming Handbook for Clinical Behavior Therapy with Children.
