LEWISTOWN MAN TO ATTEND NATIONAL ROTC CONFERENCE

MISSOULA--

Cadet Lt. Col. Roger Gary Fisk, Lewistown, was selected as the most outstanding ROTC cadet from the University of Montana. He will represent UM at the sixth annual Gen. George C. Marshall Award Conference in Lexington, Va., April 12-15.

The U.S. Army and the General George C. Marshall Foundation sponsor the conference, where the top Army ROTC cadets from all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and Guam meet with Army officers.

The award winners were selected on the basis of scholastic excellence, military skills and leadership abilities.

Fisk, the son of Albert and Marlene Fisk, is majoring in psychology at UM and is active in ROTC. Fall quarter, as ROTC battalion commander, Fisk was in charge of coordinating cadet training and activities. Last summer at ROTC Advanced Camp, his unit chose him as the outstanding cadet. He is a member of the U.S. Army Reserve, Lewiston, and in June will be commissioned in the reserve.

Lt. Col. Lewis Higinbotham, UM professor of military science, said that Fisk is a student leader of whom the University of Montana and Montana citizens can be very proud.
