Roger McDonald, associate professor of music at the University of Montana and principal oboist with the Missoula Symphony, will give a free oboe recital on Sunday, Feb. 20, at 3:30 p.m. at the St. Francis Church. The recital is part of the Hamilton Community Concert Series.

The program will consist of Partita 6 by Telemann; Sonatina by Gordon Jacob; Duo for Flute and Oboe by Alberto Ginastera; Piece V by Cesar Frank; Sonata by Poulenc; and Drei Romanzen, Opus 94 by Robert Schumann.

McDonald will be assisted by Debra Shorrock, flute; Steven Hesla, piano; and John Ellis, harpsichord and organ.

McDonald holds a master of music degree from Yale University and a bachelor of music from the University of Oklahoma. He studied oboe with Robert Bloom, now on the Juilliard faculty, and Richard Killmer of Eastman School of Music. His teaching experience includes positions at the North Carolina School of the Arts and Wesleyan University.

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
