UM STUDENT RANKED IN GLAMOUR'S TOP TEN

MISSOULA--

Former University of Montana student body president Marquette McRae-Zook has been named one of the Top Ten College Women of 1983 by Glamour Magazine.

McRae-Zook, who stepped down as the Associated Students of UM president last month, will receive \$1,000 and will be featured in the August issue of the national magazine.

She was chosen on the basis of her academic record, a personal essay on her college achievements, personal recommendations and extensive interviews with UM professors and administrators by the magazine's staff.

McRae-Zook, a native of Columbus, Ga., came to Montana in 1980 when her husband, Gary, returned to Polson, his hometown. She majored in interpersonal communication and radio-television at UM.

"Much of the essay I wrote for the contest was about how Montana was unique to me and how I worked to become familiar with the state and UM," she said.

"I was a member of several statewide education groups which helped University students," she added.

While ASUM president, McRae-Zook helped lobby the Legislature for funding for a state college work-study program.
