GRADE AND HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR UM SUMMER COMPUTER CAMP
MISSOULA--

Students entering the fifth through 12th grades are eligible for summer computer camp sponsored by Missoula's School District 1 and the Center for Continuing Education at the University of Montana.

Three sessions are scheduled this year: Session I-- June 20-July 1 from 9 a.m. to noon; Session II-- June 20 - July 1 from 1 to 4 p.m.; Session III-- July 5-15 from 1 to 4 p.m., including Saturday, July 9. Sections in Logo, BASIC and advanced programming are offered during each session.

The fee is \$125 per session with a \$25 non-refundable deposit due by May 20. Students may enroll in more than one session.
