PHOTOS OF CHINA BY UM STUDENT  
TO BE EXHIBITED MAY 31 TO JUNE 10

Contemporary China as depicted in black-and-white photographs will be on exhibit at the University of Montana May 31 through June 10. The exhibition will be in the UM University Center Gallery, located in the UC second floor lounge.

The photographs, titled "China: A View Inside the People's Republic," are the work of Bruce Sadler Rose, a junior in liberal arts and Asian studies at UM.

Rose said the photographs "show the reawakening of ancient traditions that are slowly returning to the People's Republic of China during the redevelopment of a post-'cultural revolution' culture."

Rose has had previous exhibitions at the UM Gallery of Visual Arts and the Missoula Museum of the Arts.

A free public reception for the artist will begin at 7 p.m. Tuesday, May 31, in the gallery. Refreshments will be provided.

Gallery hours are 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. weekdays and noon to 4 p.m. weekends.
