ADVANCED PHARMACY COURSE SCHEDULED DURING UM SUMMER PRE-SESSION

MISSOULA--

"Antimicrobial Therapy," a course on the use of antimicrobial drugs in the clinical setting, is scheduled for Monday, June 13, through Friday, June 17, at the University of Montana.

Lectures will be held each day from 9 a.m. to noon with a discussion conference scheduled from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m. Both morning and afternoon meetings will be held in room 102 of the Chemistry-Pharmacy Building on campus.

Cost for the course, which has been approved for two academic credits or 25 hours of continuing education for pharmacists, is \$60.

Pre-registration is required by June 6.

Participants will learn about major infectious disease states, the basic drug versus bug approach to therapy, and other factors that must be considered in the choice and use of antimicrobials.

Instructors are William Doctor and Patricia Lobeda, both assistant professors of pharmacy at UM; J. Michael Kinsella, a pharmacy instructor at UM; and M.S. Winship, a Missoula physician.
