RUDYARD GOODE SELECTED AS
MOST INSPIRATIONAL TEACHER AT UM

MISSOULA--

The University of Montana seniors of 1982 chose Rudyard B. Goode, professor and former dean of the UM School of Business Administration, as the Most Inspirational Teacher during their years at UM.

Goode will receive \$250 and acknowledgement of his work at UM commencement ceremonies June 12.

Other UM professors who received a large number of votes from the 1982 seniors include John Photiades, associate professor of economics; William Wilmot, professor of interpersonal communication; Paul G. Lauren, professor of history; and Larry Gianchetta, associate professor of business administration and chairman of the management department.

Goode was the program director for administration at the Research Center of the School of Business and Public Administration at the University of Missouri at Columbia before coming to UM in 1969 as UM dean of business. He resigned the deanship in 1976 to teach finance courses full-time at UM.

He also has been active in community organizations and served as president of the Missoula Area Chamber of Commerce in 1978.

Goode, a native of Junior, W. Va., graduated cum laude from David and Elkins College, Elkin, W. Va., in 1947. He received a master's degree in economics in 1952 and a doctorate in 1953 from the University of Virginia in Charlottesville.

He has taught at the University of Missouri, the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque and Birmingham-Southern College in Birmingham, Ala. He also worked
