ARMS-CONTROL LECTURE SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED

MISSOULA--

Speakers and topics for the remaining "Arms Control in the Nuclear Age" lectures have been announced by the program sponsor, the Environmental Studies Program at the University of Montana.

Bhaichand Patel, a senior political affairs officer in the United Nations Department of Disarmament Affairs, will speak on "A United Nations View of the Arms Race" at 7:15 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 30.

Father Robert Drinan, professor at Georgetown University Law School in Washington, D.C., and former U.S. representative from Massachusetts, will talk on "Beyond the Freeze" at 7:15 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 6.

The lectures in the UM Underground Lecture Hall are free to the public. Each talk will be broadcast over KUFM, the public radio station at UM, the following Saturdays at 7 p.m. The lectures will be aired over KEMC, public radio in Billings, at noon Dec. 13 and 17, respectively.

Panel discussions will be recorded and broadcast from KUFM at 7 p.m. on Nov. 26 and Dec. 17.

On Nov. 26 the panel will discuss the ABC television movie "The Day After," which was shown on ABC affiliates Nov. 20. Members of the panel will be Michael Marks, a Missoula psychologist, and UM associate professors Stewart Justman, Greg MacDonald and Burke Townsend. Townsend will moderate the panel.

The Dec. 17 panel will be a wrap-up and "where do we go from here?" session for the entire lecture series. Panelists will be Robert McKelvey, UM mathematics

professor; Richard Barrett, UM associate professor of economics; Kermit Edmonds, Hellgate High School teacher; and Michael Kadas, a UM student and Democratic state representative from Missoula.

The panel discussions will be aired over KEMC, Billings, at noon Dec. 6 and Dec. 20, respectively.

Patel is a native of Fiji and received a master of laws degree in 1965 from the London School of Economics. He joined the U.N. in 1971 and served in several media relations posts, including spokesman for the U.N. peacekeeping forces in the Middle East from 1976-77.

Drinan, an attorney and a Jesuit priest, is a well-known American activist and former congressman. He was elected to six terms to the U.S. House of Representatives from Boston, first in 1970, until a controversial papal order forbade him to campaign again in 1980. He had been a member of powerful congressional committees, including the House Judiciary Committee, which voted to impeach Richard Nixon, and the Internal Security committee.

Drinan has been an advocate of civil liberties and social service issues. He has authored five books and is best known for "Vietnam and Armageddon" and "Honor the Promise: America's Commitment to Israel."
