COURSE ON CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS
TO BE OFFERED FOR UM CREDIT

MISSOULA--

"Montana Corrections," a course consisting of tours of correctional facilities and presentations by the staff and residents of these institutions, will be offered June 11-16 by the University of Montana sociology department.

Professor Richard Vandiver will instruct the class. Two credits may be earned by completing the course.

The course will be conducted on the road and includes tours of two prisons, two training schools and several public and private residential correctional facilities for adults and juveniles in the state. Emphasis will be placed on the sociology of corrections. Students will be required to complete pre-course reading assignments and post-course assignments.

The fee for the course is \$140, which includes the cost of two undergraduate or graduate credits as well as transportation costs. Arrangements have been made for participants to camp out at local churches at no charge. Students will pay for meals.

Enrollment for the course is limited to 12 participants. Pre-registration and payment of a \$50 non-refundable deposit are required by May 14, with the balance of course fees due June 1.
