STUDENT OFFICERS TAKE SEATS AT UM

MISSOULA--

The reins of student government at the University of Montana were handed over this spring to newly elected officers and Central Board delegates of the Associated Students of UM. They will serve through winter quarter 1985.

Phoebe J. Patterson, a UM graduate student from Mendocino, Calif., is the ASUM president, the second woman to hold the position since World War II. She is the daughter of Vernon and Vilma Patterson, of Mendocino, Calif., and a 1972 graduate of Acalanes High School in Lafayette, Calif. She is studying rural, town and regional planning at UM.

Jeremy Sauter, a junior at UM from New York City, was elected ASUM vice-president. The son of Van Gordon Sauter of New York and Patricia Sauter of Ridgefield, Conn., he graduated from Staples High School in Westport, Conn., in 1981. At UM, Sauter studies radio-television and is a member of the UM Judo Club.

Greg Gullickson, a junior from Big Sandy, was elected ASUM business manager. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Cliff Gullickson, Big Sandy, and a 1981 graduate of Big Sandy High School. Gullickson studies business at UM and also is a member of the UM Advocates service honorary.

The ASUM Central Board consists of these officers and 20 delegates who act as the legislative body for the student government. Among their activities as student representatives, they allocate nearly a half million dollars in student activity fees each year to student groups and service agencies.
