UM STUDENTS RECEIVE SHULTS SCHOLARSHIPS

MISSOULA--

Two University of Montana students, Ann Neussendorfer of Anaconda and Nicole Altenburg of Kalispell, have been awarded \$500 Dosia J. Shults Scholarships for 1984-85.

Neussendorfer is a junior in psychology and a graduate of Anaconda High School. Altenburg graduated from Flathead High School and is a junior majoring in business administration at UM.

The Shults Scholarship was created in 1980 by Dosia J. Shults, a 1933 UM journalism graduate from Big Sandy, who is the publisher of the Adams County Record in Hettinger, N.D. Two scholarships are awarded annually to outstanding UM students who graduated from Big Sandy High School or are residents of Choteau County. If no acceptable applicants are found in those two areas, the scholarship is awarded to another Montana applicant.

The scholarship is given from more than \$175,000 in undergraduate scholarships funded by the UM Foundation. Founded in 1952, the foundation has become the principal source of academic scholarship funds for the university, providing scholarships in virtually every discipline.
