- 000-004 CBS TV interviewer's introduction of Senator Mansfield.
- 004-008 If the House doesn't uphold the veto then it will be up to the Senate to override the veto.
- 009-030 A synopsis of what programs the veto would affect. The Senator's opinion that instead of a veto there should have been a phase out of the program where it is over emphasized. Where money could have been cut from and channeled into programs to aid the people of the United States. Will the President compromise on a new bill for the HEW, and where would the compromises come from.
- 034-048 Thoughts on Judge Carswell facing of the Judiciary Committee. Personal feeling regarding a statement Judge Carswell made 22 years ago. Clarence Mitchell's opinion re: the statement that Judge Carswell made. Senator disagrees with Mr. Mitchell's view that the President wants a segregationist on the court.
- 049-063 What does the Senator find wrong about President Nixon's administration. Senator doesn't agree with the veto of the Labor, HEW appropriation bill and should be reconsidered by the President. Approval of the President getting out of Viet Nam. Should speed up the withdrawal of American troops out of Viet Nam.
- 064-073 The Senator is not satisfied with what's being done to preserve and replentish the nation's resources but working together something should be done however it should not become a political issue. Outlook of the election year in regards to Republicans controlling the Senate.
- 074-092 Senator's defence of his support of the "no knock" section of a Drug Bill. Favors strong Organized Crime control bill. Senator responds on how to preserve the Constitution's Preservation of Privacy, and still have "no knock" section of the bill.
