10% of gardeners are veterans

99% shared food with friends/neighbors/food bank

and **100%** shared gardening knowledge with others

Over **90%** of gardeners valued the social interaction and having control over their food

Over **90%** of gardeners gained mental/emotional wellbeing, ate more fresh veggies, and got more exercise because of their garden plots.
