



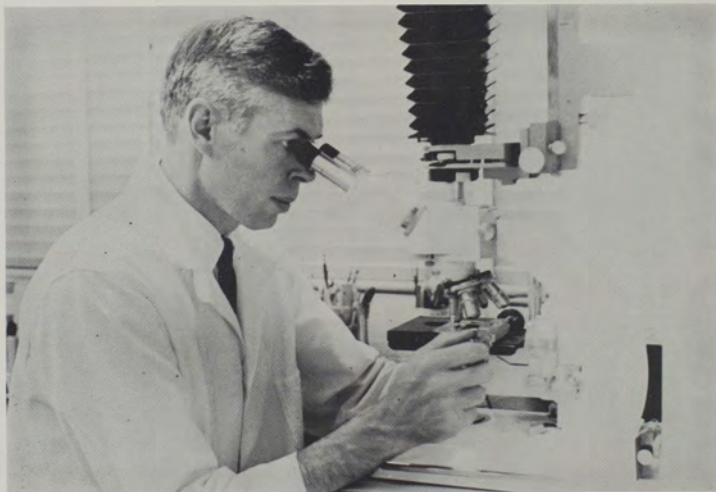
Outstanding Students

EDUCATION

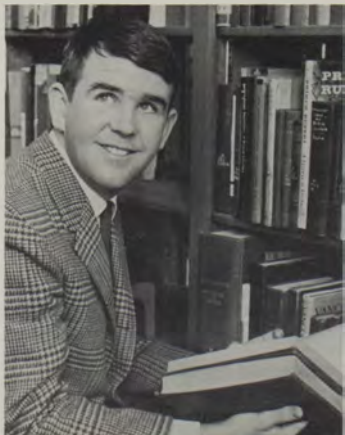

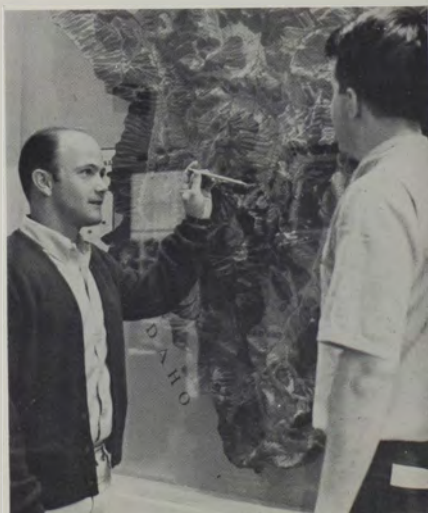
MARVIN BRITTENHAM
