Miss Kahn-tineta Horn, the Montana Indian Council's first president, said that Dr. Arnold Bolle, dean of the Montana State University School of Forestry, has been elected president of the Montana Conservation Council for the third time in a meeting at Lewistown. The council is a citizens' group which is seeking a coordinated program for the protection of natural resources in Montana. Currently, the council is setting up a program for water development in the state, according to Dean Bolle.

Also slated to address the Indian high school conference throughout the region are Bruce Wilkie, Dean of the Montana State University, and Sister Providentia, College of Great Falls, who has worked with the Indian community in Great Falls. Wilkie will speak on "Intergroup Relationships" and Sister Providentia, on "Non-ward Representation in the Indian Community".

The conference will include talks and panel discussions by tribal leaders, Bureau of Indian Affairs personnel, and representatives to the coordinating committee. Particular attention will be given to isolationism and the nationalistic movement.
