MISSOULA--

Twenty-five certified public accountants and business education instructors from throughout Montana are expected for a seminar at the University of Montana to discuss what is needed by beginning CPAs when they launch careers in public accounting.

The seminar, entitled "Horizons for a Profession," will be from 9 a.m. - 3 p.m. in UM Lodge conference rooms and will feature material from a book with the same title written by Robert H. Roy, dean of engineering at the Johns Hopkins University, and Dr. James H. MacNeill, chairman of the accounting department at Fordham University.

During the seminar recommendations in the study will be evaluated as guides for accounting education.

Discussion leaders will include Dr. Harvey Larson, chairman of the commerce department at Montana State University, Bozeman, and UM faculty members, Dr. Jack J. Kempner, acting chairman of the accounting and finance department; Dr. Robert Wallace, chairman of the economics department; Hubert Breuninger, associate professor of accounting, and Dwight M. Edmonds, assistant professor of accounting.
