WILDLIFE SEMINARS TO BE HELD ON UM CAMPUS

MISSOULA---

Dr. Morgan Berthrong, clinical professor of pathology of the University of Colorado School of Medicine, will present two seminars at the University of Montana May 9 and 10. His visit is sponsored by the Montana Cooperative Wildlife Research Unit and the UM zoology department.

The seminars will be in room 207 of the UM Health Sciences building at 4 p.m. Thursday, May 9 and 1 p.m. Friday, May 10.

The subject of his talks will be "Comparative Morphology--Bear and Man." In his presentation Dr. Berthrong will attempt to correlate both the structure and the function of the organs of the grizzly bear with those of man and will discuss these correlations.

Dr. Berthrong has worked for a number of years with Dr. Frank C. Craighead and Dr. John J. Craighead, UM faculty members affiliated with the Montana Cooperative Wildlife Research Unit, on a study of grizzly bears in Yellowstone National Park.

The public is invited to attend the seminars.
