Patricia Lynn Zieske, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Norman A. Zieske, Sidney, will crown the new queen. Miss Zieske was the 1968 Homecoming Queen.

Coeds not chosen queen will be princesses in her court and will participate in homecoming activities beginning Friday.

On tap for the queen and her court Friday are an Alumni Association noon luncheon in the University Center Ballroom and a prehomecoming party at the Missoula Elks Club at 5 p.m.

Saturday the queen and her court will ride in the Homecoming Parade from the campus to downtown Missoula and back beginning at 9:30 a.m. The coeds will attend an alumni-faculty luncheon at 11:30 a.m. Saturday in the UC Ballroom.

Johnson said the queen and her court will be introduced during half time ceremonies at the homecoming football game between the University of Montana Grizzlies and the Idaho State University Bengals. Game time is 2:10 p.m. at new Dornblaser Field. The game will be preceded by a parade starting at 1:30 p.m. at the field.

The queen and her court will be among the guests at the annual Homecoming Concert at 8:15 p.m. Saturday in the Field House.
